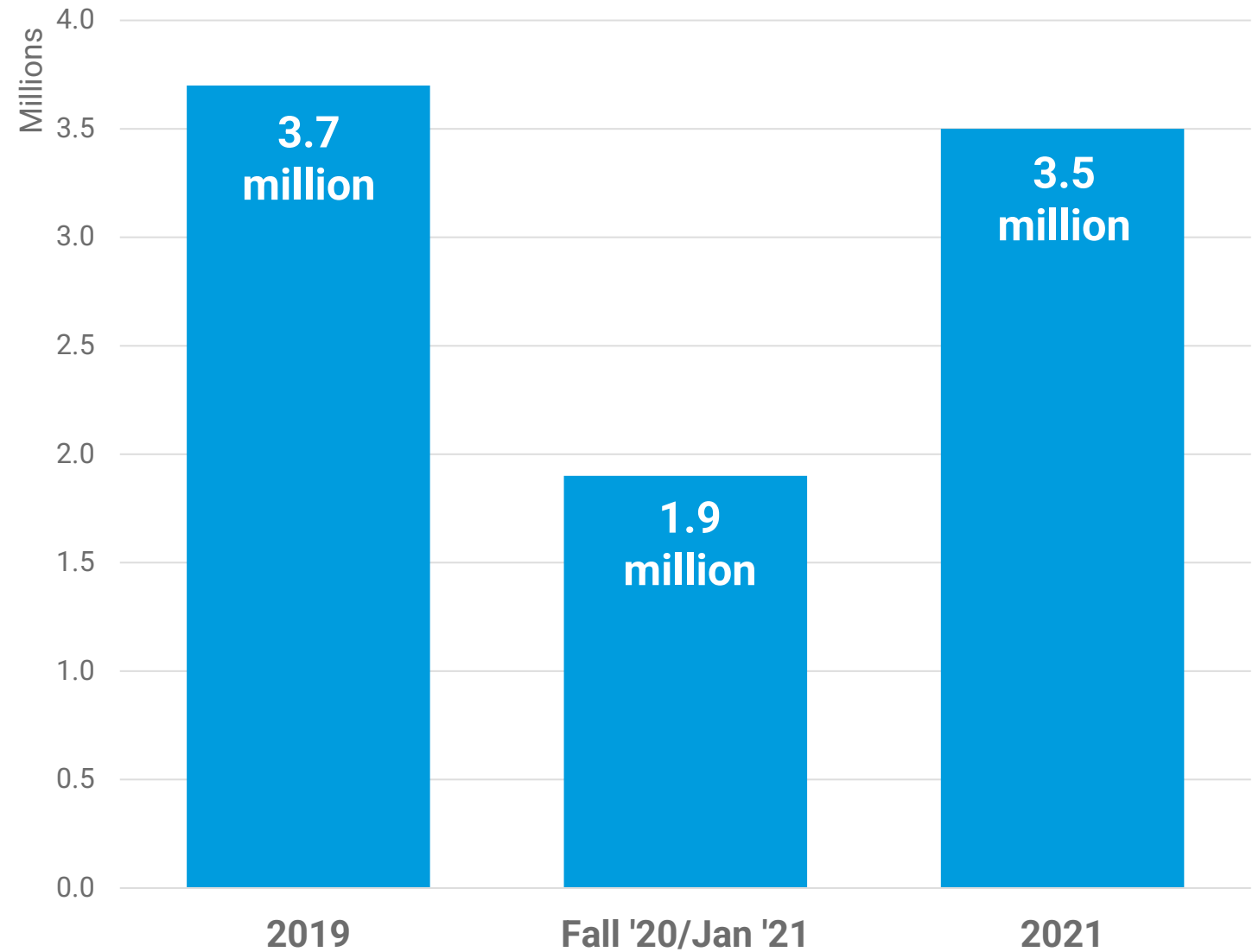

All students will take the **digital PSAT™ 8/9 and PSAT/NMSQT starting in fall 2023**, followed by the digital PSAT™ 10 in spring 2024.

Digital SAT Suite

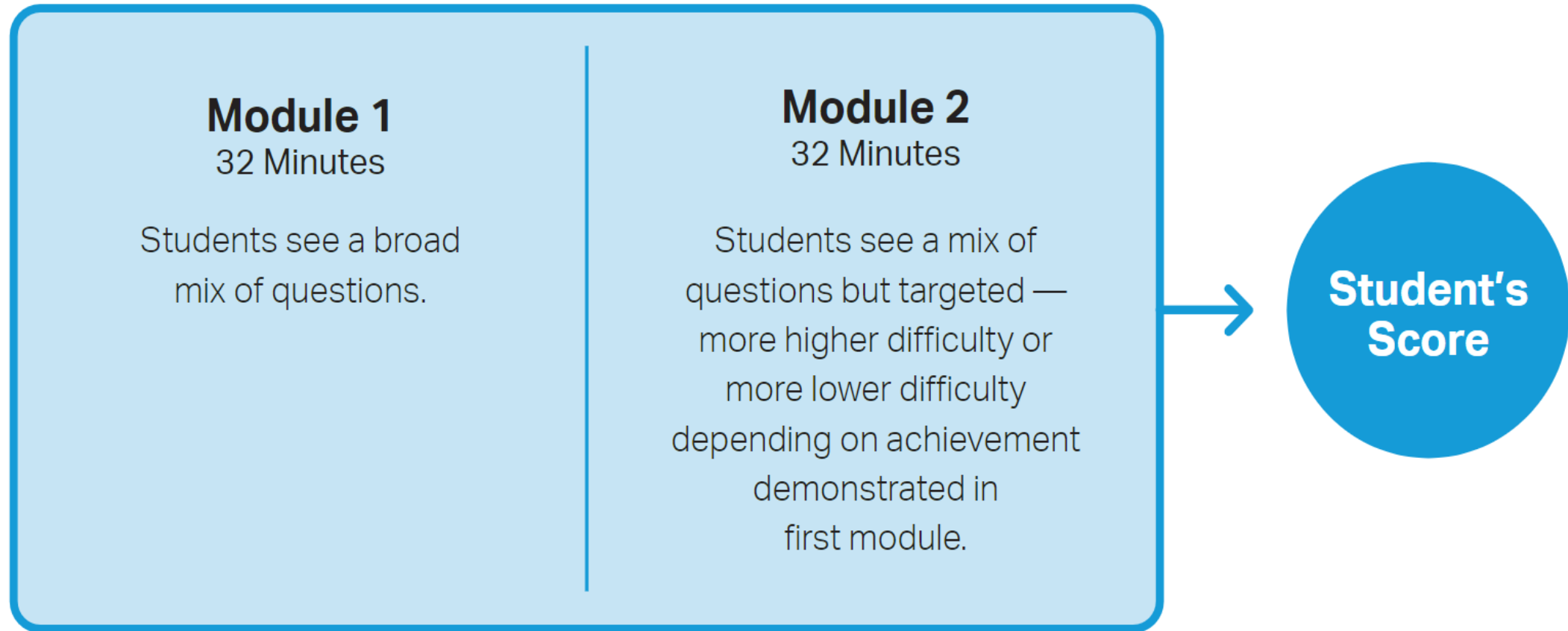
What's staying the same

- ✓ The digital SAT Suite will continue to measure the knowledge and skills that **matter most for college and career readiness**
- ✓ **The digital SAT will still be scored on a 1600 scale**, and no concordance is required with the current paper and pencil exam.
- ✓ The digital SAT will still be **administered in a school or in a test center** with a proctor present (not at home)
- ✓ Students will still have **free, world-class practice resources on Khan Academy®**.
- ✓ **We'll continue to support all students**, including those who need accommodations on test day

What's changing

- ✓ **International students will have access to two additional SAT administrations** starting when we launch in March 2023 – adding administrations in June and November.
- ✓ **Students will take the SAT Suite assessments on a laptop or tablet.**
- ✓ The SAT will be shorter – **about two hours instead of three.**
- ✓ **Calculators will be allowed** on the entire math section.
- ✓ **The digital SAT will be more secure and flexible.** Each student will get a unique test form, and states, schools, and districts will have much more flexibility for when they administer the digital SAT.

Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing



Benefits of Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing

- More precise measurement
- Shorter tests
- Questions are tailored according to students' achievement
- More secure testing
- Tolerates disruptions in internet connectivity
- Allows students to navigate back to questions within a module

Digital Testing Application

The digital testing application will include many test tools for students. Examples include:



Mark for review

Students can flag and return to any question within a given test module they want to come back to later.



Testing timer

A clock counts down the time remaining in each module. Students can hide the timer, and they get an alert when 5 minutes remain in the module.



Calculator

A built-in graphing calculator is available on the entire Math section. Students can also bring their own approved calculator.



Reference sheet

On the Math section, students have access to a list of common formulas.



Annotation

Students can highlight any part of a question and leave themselves a note.

Technology Support on Test Day

- If the internet disconnects during testing, students will still be able to progress through the test with no disruption.
- If a student's computer runs out of battery, they can simply plug in, restart their device, and pick up where they left off—all their work will be saved, and they won't lose testing time.
- A Technology Monitor will be present at each digital SAT administration.



With the transition to digital tests, College Board is working to address inequities in access to technology.

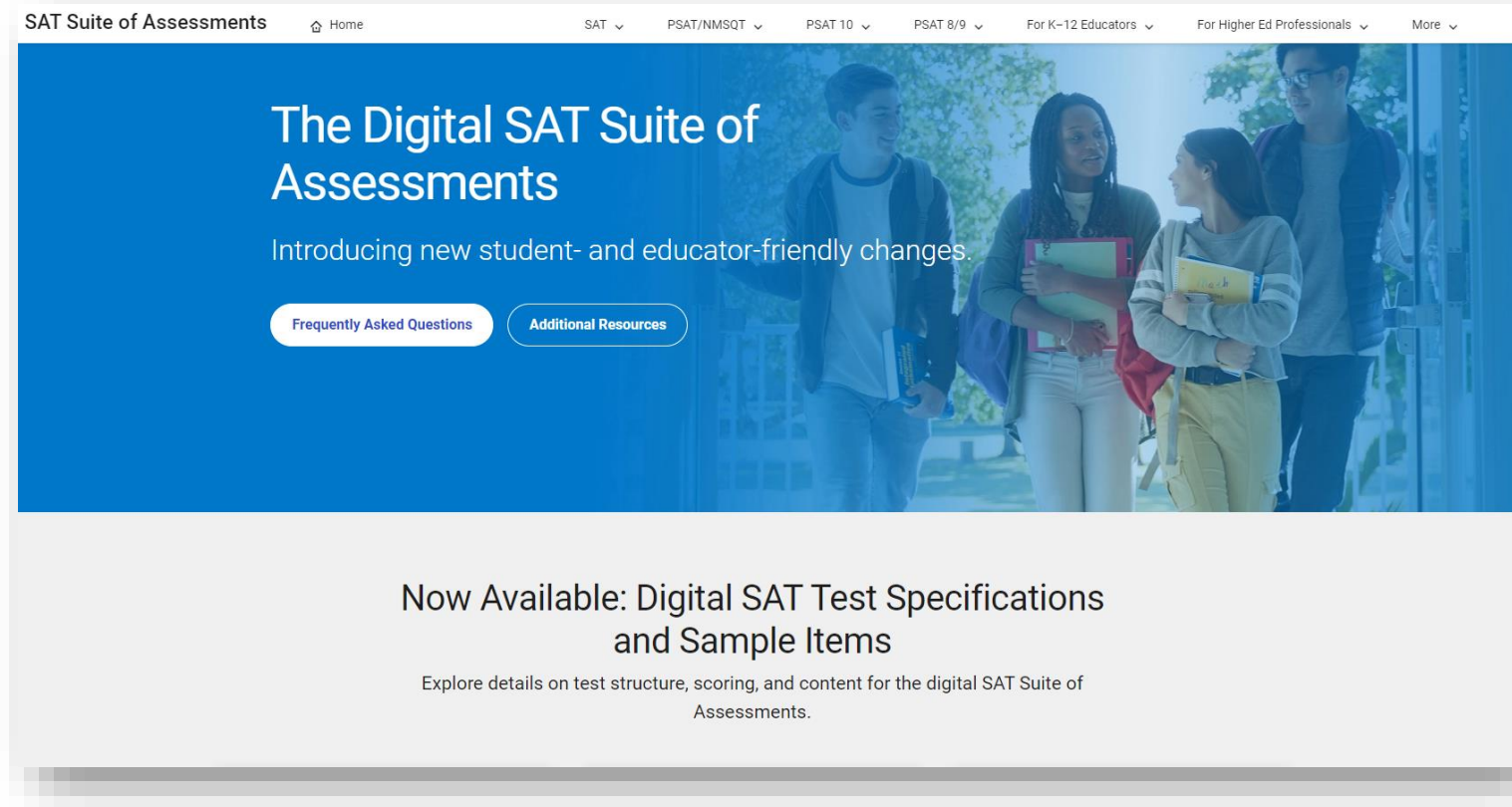

- There are 38 AP® subjects.
- Universities are using AP exam scores for purpose of admissions
- Financial assistance for AP Exam fees is available for students who need it.
- No matter their score, taking an AP course and exam helps students stand out to colleges.
- More schools than ever before are accepting AP scores for credit and placement. Students should take advantage of their **free score sends** following the exam administration.

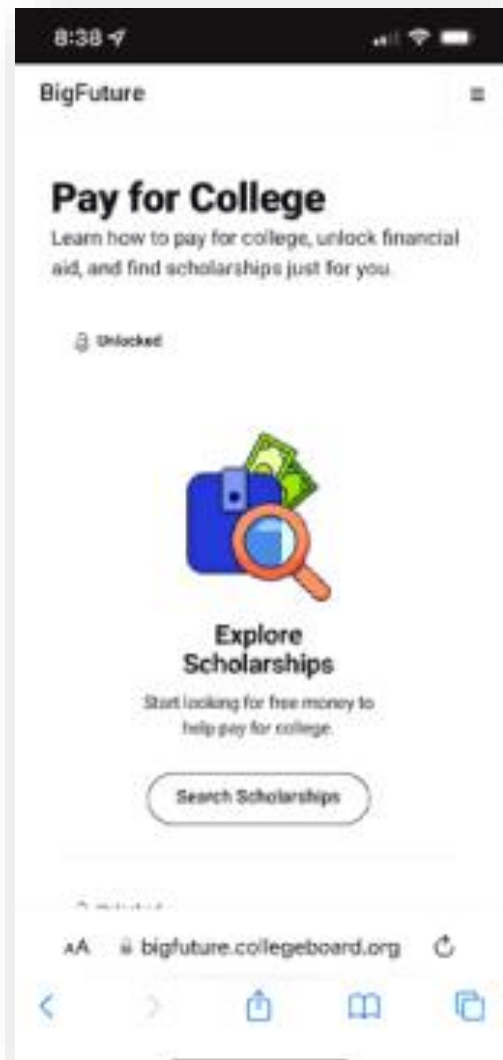

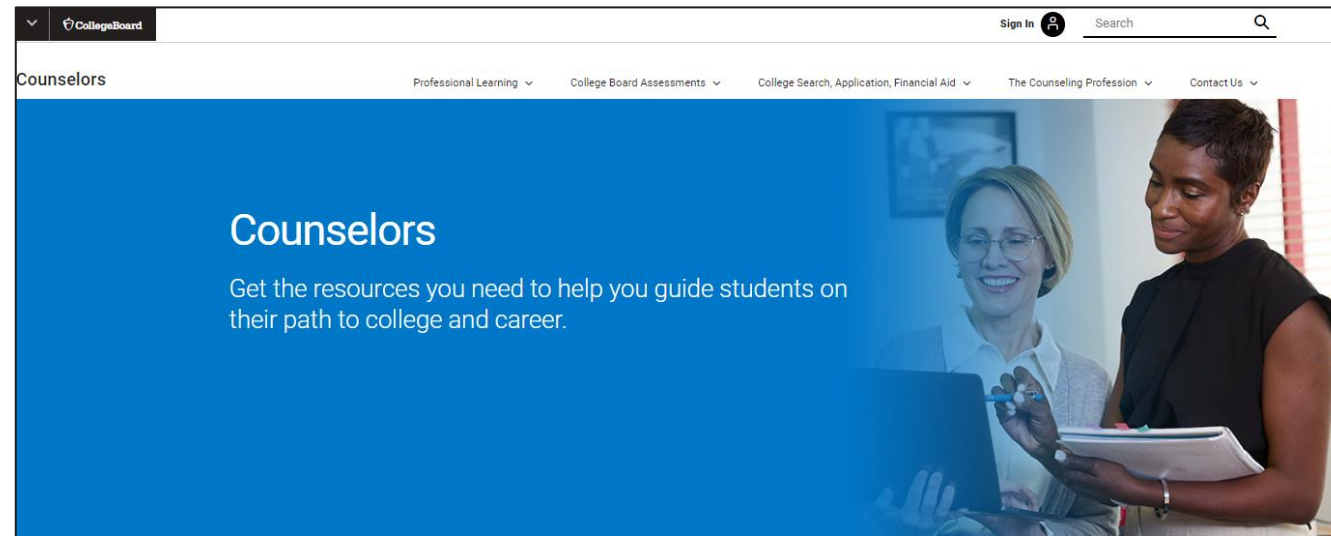
CSS Profile Reminders

- The CSS Profile is an online application used by colleges and scholarship programs to award Institutional (their own) aid.
- Most students complete the application in their **senior year** of high school. Universities may have different deadlines - be sure to check with each university that you are applying to.
- The CSS Profile® is **available October 1** for the next school year.
- Can be completed by domestic, **international, or undocumented students**.
- First-time, transfer, returning, and independent U.S. undergraduate students are eligible for fee waivers.
