MUST READ FOR STUDENTS: IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXAM DAY

YOU SHOULD BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO THE EXAM ROOM:

- An original and valid Passport or Aadhar Card (no other form of identity will be accepted at Indian test centers and you will not be able to test without ID)
- Admission Ticket (shared with you by the AP Coordinator at your chosen test center)
- Your 6-digit school code. Self-study or home-schooled students will need a self-study code. This will be printed on the Admission Ticket.
- Several sharpened No. 2 (or HB) pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams
- A watch that does not have internet access, does not beep, and does not have an alarm.
- Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking the AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exams. (Review the AP Calculator Policy page carefully: <https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/takingtheexam/exam-policies/calculator-policy>)
- A ruler or straightedge only if you are taking an AP Physics Exam (Protractors are not allowed)
- Your AP Student Pack* (you will receive this from the test center at your first exam)

* Your AP Student Pack has sticker labels with a unique 2019 AP Number, which identifies you to the AP Program and ties your answer sheets to your student record. Use the same AP Number throughout the entire May 2019 testing period (both regular and late) to ensure your scores appear correctly on your consolidated score report. **Do not use more than one AP Number or share your AP Number with others, as that will result in delays and/or errors during scoring.**

YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CARRY THE FOLLOWING TO THE EXAM ROOM:

- Electronic equipment (phones, smartwatches, or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices, portable listening or recording devices—MP3 player, iPod®, etc.—cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices) are prohibited in the exam room and break areas.
- Books, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, No. 3 pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Computers.
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Ear plugs.
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- Food or drink.
- Clipboards.

ARRIVAL TIME:

- You are required to arrive at the testing site at least 30 minutes prior to your exam, i.e. latest by 7:30AM for the 8:00AM exams and by 11:30AM for the 12:00PM exams. For the Physics C exam starting at 2:00PM, you must report by 1:30PM.
- Students will not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended. Do not ask to leave early if you finish your exam before the official end time. Please check the duration of your exam before exam date. An additional 60 minutes over and above the exam duration will be needed to complete administration related activities, which will take place in the beginning of the exam, so please factor that in when estimating the end time for your exam.
- Get a good night's rest before your exam and eat a nutritious breakfast. You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage to the testing site for your 10-minute break. However, food and drink are prohibited in the exam room and during testing.
- You are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and the school/center where you are taking your Exams. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score.

REQUIRED READING BEFORE EXAM DAY:

3. Completing Your AP Exam Answer Sheet(s): It is important that you correctly complete the student information sections of the Answer Sheet so your AP Exam scores will be reported without delays. Remember: Follow ALL instructions read by proctor. Your proctor will be reading standardized exam instructions that guide you through how to complete the answer sheet correctly, as well as through each part of the exam sections. Do not skip ahead and do not open any exam materials or remove the plastic shrinkwrap from exam packets until the proctor tells you to do so. Failure to comply may result in a security violation and cancelled scores.
